Keith and Jean Schultz, long-time Meeker Cooperative members, installed an air source heat pump in May 2022 after their air conditioning unit broke down on the first hot day of spring. "Consistent heating and cooling" is the biggest benefit they have experienced. Despite the higher initial cost of the equipment, Keith and Jean trusted the recommendations of Brian and Tim from Servin Plumbing and Heating and opted for the heat pump and Meeker Cooperative's load management services. This decision earned them a \$1,050 rebate from Meeker Cooperative and continues to save them money on their electricity bill with a lower rate through the off-peak program.

"We've also been very happy with how you can heat and cool with the same unit. It's our primary heat source until about Thanksgiving," Keith shared. "That's when we finally turn on our propane furnace."

The Schultz family also appreciates the benefits of the load management program, which helps Meeker balance their usage load and keep prices down. Their off-peak electric boiler for in-floor heat and off-peak air source heat pump have proven effective. Keith highlights, "I always tell people about the heat pump and how it differs from an air conditioner. I've convinced a number of friends to explore air source heat pumps."

Having been members since 1974, the Schultzes are firm believers in the Cooperative's services. 22-27-301 Keith encourages others, "The answers are there, just ask the questions!"

and copper discs, separated by pieces of cloth soaked in saltwater, which facilitated the flow of electric current. 30-11-226 Lynne Lundquist Volta's invention not only demonstrated that electricity could be generated chemically but also laid the foundation for future advancements in electrochemistry and battery technology.

PEANUT BUTTER RICE KRISPIES | SUBMITTED BY: ROSALEA HOEFT



INGREDIENTS

- 1 C. White Karo Syrup
- 1 C. Brown Sugar
- 2 C. Peanut Butter
- 5 C. Rice Krispies
- 1 C. Butter

- 1 Small Package Instant Vanilla Pudding
- 6 Tbsp. Milk
- 4 C. Powdered Sugar
- 12 oz Package Chocolate Chips

DIRECTIONS

Melt Karo syrup, brown sugar, and peanut butter together. Fold in Rice Krispies then pack into a 9 x 13 pan and refrigerate. Beat together 1/2 cup softened butter, instant vanilla pudding, milk, and powdered sugar. Spread over first layer and refrigerate. When firm melt 1/2 C. Butter and chocolate chips. Spread over bars like frosting.
